Hartford Resident Bruce Milne Elected to Chair Crow Canyon Archaeological Center Board

(CORTEZ, Colo.)—November 1, 2011—The Crow Canyon Archaeological Center today announced that Hartford, Wis., resident Bruce Milne was elected as chair of the Center’s Board of Trustees. Crow Canyon is a not-for-profit research and education organization located in southwestern Colorado.

“Bruce has been an ardent supporter of Crow Canyon and a key member of the Board of Trustees,” said Crow Canyon President and CEO Deborah Gangloff. “His innovative work in supporting educational programs at the Center and in the Milwaukee area have benefited students across the country.”

Milne has been a Crow Canyon member since 1990 and was elected to the Board of Trustees in October 2000. He has served as the vice chair of the board since 2008 and as chair of the Investment Committee since 2006. He was also a member of Crow Canyon’s presidential search committee in 2009.

Milne also helped establish and fund the National Youth Education Scholarship Fund, an endowed fund to support scholarships for youth to participate in Crow Canyon programs and to boost educational expertise at the Center as needed. In addition, he was the founder and director of Crow Canyon’s Project Outreach, which provided archaeology education programs to students in the greater Milwaukee area.

Bruce is the former president and CEO of Trump Company, a food brokerage firm in the Midwest. He also serves on the boards of Discovery World at Pier Wisconsin in Milwaukee and the Tyndale Seminary in Amsterdam, Netherlands.

The not-for-profit Crow Canyon Archaeological Center, located near Cortez, Colorado, conducts long-term, multidisciplinary research into the ancestral Pueblo Indians of the southwestern United States and provides experiential education programs for adults and children. The Center also collaborates with American Indians on a wide variety of initiatives of mutual interest, including research projects, education curricula, and language- and cultural-preservation programs. Crow Canyon’s Board of Trustees is made up of individuals from across the nation who volunteer their time, talent, and resources to the Center.
