Beautiful beaches and rugged coastlines, distinctive architecture and gracious vineyards—all make this area one of the world's most stunning locations. Join this "pre-trip" tour that highlights the region's natural and historical landmarks, including Cape of Good Hope, Stellenbosch, and Robben Island.

Sunday, July 8: Arrive Cape Town

Arrive in Cape Town, South Africa, by 4:00 p.m. for transfer to the Vineyard Hotel, where you enjoy a welcome dinner and introductory program. Overnight, Vineyard Hotel. **(D)**

Monday, July 9: Cape Peninsula

This morning, weather permitting, you ride the cable car up Table Mountain, a prominent landmark overlooking the city. Then the group drives along the Cape Peninsula to Boulders Beach, to view African penguins in their native habitat. At Cape Peninsula National Park, you take a short walk to Cape Point, where the Atlantic and Indian oceans meet in a spray of sea foam at the Cape of Good Hope. A stroll through the reserve offers spectacular scenery and the possibility of spotting bontebok, eland, and zebra. Overnight, Vineyard Hotel. **(B, L, D)**

Tuesday, July 10:

Wine Country • Stellenbosch

Today, journey into wine country, stopping in the beautiful small town

of Stellenbosch. Founded by the Dutch in 1679, Stellenbosch is the second-oldest town in South Africa; its well-preserved architectural gems include many examples of the style known as Cape Dutch. Enjoy lunch and sample fine South African wines at a local winery-restaurant before returning to Cape Town in the early afternoon to visit the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront. Overnight, Vineyard Hotel. (B, L, D)

Wednesday, July 11: Robben Island • Windhoek, Namibia

Early in the day, tour the World Heritage site of Robben Island, where Nelson Mandela was interred from 1963 until his release in 1990. Then return to Cape Town for your flight to Windhoek, Namibia, where you join the main Namibia tour. (B, L, D)

TOUR DETAILS

Tuition: Tuition is per person and based on shared accommodations. Tuition includes accommodations, meals listed, entry fees and permits, tours, and transportation from arrival in Cape Town, South Africa, on July 8, 2012, until arrival in Windhoek, Namibia, on July 11, 2012. Gratuities are not included.

Program prices are based on current tariffs and currency exchange rates and are subject to change. Crow Canyon reserves the right to levy a surcharge, if necessary, prior to the final payment date.

Transatlantic Air: Transatlantic air flights are not included. For assistance making arrangements, we recommend Travel Management, Inc., in Post Falls, Idaho. E-mail crow@tmitravel.net, or call 1-800-975-7775 and ask for the Crow Canyon representative. Or, you are welcome to make your own arrangements. Plan to arrive in Cape Town, South Africa, no later than 4:00 p.m. on July 8, 2012.

Accommodations: All nights are spent in the four-star Vineyard Hotel. Shared accommodations are based on double occupancy. Single accommodations are available for an additional fee of \$340.

What to Expect: This extension does not involve strenuous activity, but it does involve moderate walking. You will travel in a comfortable coach on paved roads.
